Twenty board members attended the July 27, 1985, meeting in Chicago.

Proposed California contract for AMSAODD Certification Project: AMSAODD to budget \$107,524, with \$44,969 for contractual society (two-year period).

Training Course: (see p. 3)

New Committees: 1) Medical Student/House Officer: Keith E. McManus; 2) Advisory (former AMSAODD leaders) to also function as Ethics Committee; 3) Ad Hoc Committee on Gay and Lesbian Alcohol/Drug Problems: Larry Siegel, MD.

Constitution Committee: will be activated by Jess W. Bromley, MD, to clarify relationships of state chapters to regional and national, and to develop guidelines for forming state chapters.

<u>Publications Committee</u>: (Stanley E. Gitlow, MD) AMSAODD reiterated its desire to expand the name of the scientific journal to <u>Alcoholism & Other Chemical Dependencies</u>: Clinical & Experimental Research to reflect the society's overall interest in chemical addiction. Publication of quarterly <u>AMSAODD Newsletter</u> approved.

NCA Criteria: Dr. Schneider to write NCA executive director Tom Seesel about including AMSAODD members on this NCA committee.

<u>Public Policy</u>: On behalf of AMSAODD board, Dr. Weisman to write the APA about new organization AAPAA (American Academy of Psychiatrists in Alcoholism and Addictions). All its members belong to APA.

Medical Education: In report of June meeting with Chicago ACCME office, James A. Halikas, MD, "quite sure" that AMSAODD will receive reaccreditation for Category I CME credit.

<u>Peer Review</u>: Board agreed to support the APA's position that psychiatric, alcohol and substance abuse DRG's are significantly flawed. Committee (headed by Percy E. Ryberg, MD, and Sheldon Zimberg, MD) to develop position on length of stay (inpatient and outpatient).

Membership: (LeClair Bissell, MD) total now 1,850.

Treasury: names of members in arrears going to state chairpersons and regional directors. Platform budget to board in October.

Other: According to Dr. Schneider, the US Navy decision to transfer its alcoholism treatment program from medical to "line service" has been rescinded. AMSAODD's letter against the move was influential.

Next Board Meeting: October 21, 1985, in New York City.

Why certification for physicians in the field of chemical dependency? Margaret Bean-Bayog, MD, chair of the Credentialling Committee, told AMSAODD Newsletter that the definition of certification is "one who has mastered a body of knowledge." She said that "a lot of people in the alcoholism field have long wanted physicians in the field to have a high level of skills and scientific credibility" and for this body of knowledge to be accredited. Certification will cover 13 classes of drugs, with the range to include opiates, psychedelics, caffeine and nicotine.

AMSAODD will sponsor a review course prior to the exam next year. According to Anne Geller, MD, chair of the Training Course Subcommittee, the review course will be open to all physicians and will be offered in four cities in September 1986. The subcommittee, which met in July 1985, will prepare a syllabus of the material to be taught. "The course will cover the body of knowledge about alcoholism and other addictive drugs that we feel is necessary to master as physicians, in order to practice in the field of chemical dependency," Dr. Geller told AMSAODD Newsletter. Content will range from "basic pharmacology to treatment strategies to followups" and will be modelled after the review course given by the California Society for the Treatment of Alcoholism & Other Drug Dependencies. Each area will organize its own course and designate teachers for it, according to Dr. Geller, but for quality and quantity control, the material offered will be the same around the country. An AMSAODD representative will travel to each site as "overall supervisor."

Review courses for the exams, each sponsored by a local AMSAODD group, will be held in: Chicago Sept. 5-6 (Herbert D. Trace, MD); Los Angeles Sept. 12-13 (California Society for the Treatment of Alcoholism & Other Drug Dependencies, Ms. Gail Jara); New York City Sept. 19-20 (Dr. Geller); Atlanta Sept. 26-27 (Al J. Mooney III, MD).

A different committee will prepare the certification exam, which will be given simultaneously in several cities throughout the country in late October or early November. Yet another group will grade the examinations.

Chair of the Subcommittee on Testing is Anthony B. Radcliffe, MD; chair of the Standards Subcommittee is Marc Galanter, MD.

I have not calculated how many square miles per member that is, but it has to be enormous, and our problems of communication are quite different from those of people in the high-density regions. For instance, it's unlikely we will ever be able to have a regional conference, since who will come to Seattle from Arizona when they could go to California?"
